Using FEDLINK's Transfer Pay option, federal libraries can utilize the IDIQs to preserve their collections, from small to large. Our vendors are well equipped to provide expert services that meet FADGI and NARA guidelines, cataloging and metadata, derivative creation, treatments, and more. Federal libraries have access to preservation services in a variety of areas, including:

- » **Digitization of Still Images**—Imaging of reflective and transmissive materials, such as books, bound and unbound documents, photographic negatives, microforms, etc.
- » **Digital Transfer of Audio-Visual Materials**—Digitally transferring audio visual materials to updated audio, video, or motion picture film formats.
- » **Digital Archiving and Web Harvesting**—Digital archiving supports works in the public domain which can be hosted and managed by the vendor for long-term preservation. Web harvesting crawls and captures content on the web.

- » **Conservation**—Library or archival materials such as books, drawings, photographs, maps, and works of art on paper receive treatments and housing to preserve and repair artifacts.
- » **Preservation Consultation and Training**—Subject matter experts can provide educational training on preservation topics or consulting services related to preservation.
- » **Digital Forensics and Transfer (NEW!)**—Legacy and obsolete media, such as CDs, floppy discs, magnetic tapes, solid state media, etc., is examined by experts so libraries can develop a digitization plan. Data can then be transferred to updated formats.
