The mission of the United States Supreme Court Library is to assist the Justices in fulfilling their constitutional responsibilities by providing them with in-depth reference and research support. Housed in the Supreme Court building since it opened in 1935, the library collection has over 600,000 volumes and 200,000 microforms, focusing on federal and state primary law, legal treatises, and government documents. In addition to the main collection, the library maintains the official collection of Supreme Court Records and Briefs and a rare book collection. Supplementing the print materials, the library subscribes to over 100 databases covering a wide range of materials and topics.

Following a curator's tour of the Supreme Court building, library staff will provide an overview of the history, structure, and functions of the library. The visit concludes with a walking tour of the library, including the Rare Book Room and the records and briefs collection.
