Established in 1896, the **Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) Library** has one of the world's largest, broadest, and most unique collections of genealogical research materials. At the DAR Library, stories are contained not in novels, but within millions of pages of family histories, bible records, cemetery transcriptions, DAR Membership applications, and unpublished genealogical materials such as manuscripts, research notes, and personal letters. While the American Revolution serves as a major focal point, the full collection spans four centuries of U.S. history.

This event will include an overview and tour of the DAR Library, the Memorial Continental Hall, and the DAR Museum Gallery exhibition, "Fighting for Freedom: Black Craftspeople and the Pursuit of Independence." The tour will be led by Olivia Millunzi, DAR Reference Librarian, and the DAR Museum Educator Team.
