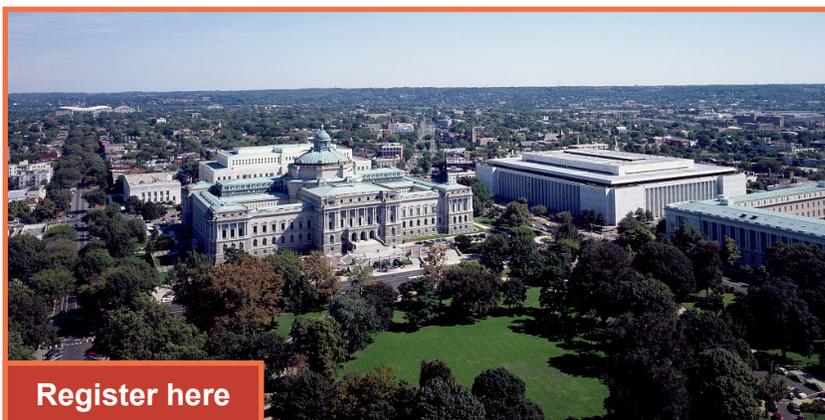

The Library of Congress (LC) is the largest research library in the world and holds approximately 178 million items including analog books, recordings, photographs, newspapers, maps, and manuscripts as well as digital and digital born information. The LC houses the Congressional Research Service, the Law Library of Congress, the U.S. Copyright Office, the Preservation Office, 21 specialized reading rooms, and much more. The LC collection includes documents in over 450 foreign languages.

Wear comfortable shoes (or request a wheelchair) as you will travel between the three LC buildings on Capitol Hill through the underground tunnels. The tour is tailored for librarians and will offer an insider's view of the reading rooms, collection policies, preservation issues, and logistics. In addition, you will visit the Moving Images Reading Room for a special viewing. You will get an opportunity to view some older films and learn about collection and preservation issues with moving images over the last 100 years.

The tour will be offered by the Federal Research Division, a division of professional researchers that tap the broad array of LC resources and collaborate with many different LC offices.
